(Semolitus atromaculatus)

Creek Chubs are a common type of minnow that like to live in small to moderate size streams and rivers. They commonly found near beaver dams with sandy bottom water. They can grow up to 10-12 inches.

These minnow mostly eat water fleas, insect larvae, and copepods when they're small. When they get bigger they eat small insects and even small fish.

Creek chubs spawn between the months of March through May. You can find these fish in calm parts of the Cathance River.
